- During this selection process Jesus avoided the educated and experienced (the religious individuals in the temple). He then sought after the loyal, strong, humble, and dedicated (dirty old fisherman).
- I believe that these were the characteristics that he was looking for because he did not want talent to run His church; He wanted the Holy Spirit to run His church.
- John 15:5 says, "Apart from me you can do nothing."
- Then Philippians 4:13 says, "I can do everything through him who gives me strength."
