### For the Love of Christ Controls us 2 Corinthians 5:13-21

### 1. We don't understand the love of God.

#### 2 Corinthians 5:13-21 (NASB)

- <sup>13</sup> For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are of sound mind, it is for you.
- <sup>14</sup> For the love of Christ controls us, having concluded this, that one died for all, therefore all died;
- <sup>15</sup> and He died for all, so that they who live might no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf.
- <sup>16</sup> Therefore from now on we recognize no one according to the flesh; even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know *Him in this way* no longer.
- <sup>17</sup> Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *he is* a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.
- <sup>18</sup> Now all *these* things are from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation,
- <sup>19</sup> namely, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation.
- <sup>20</sup> Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.
- <sup>21</sup> He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

# 2. Understanding the love of God breaks us, molds us, mends us, and changes us.

### 2 Corinthians 5:13-14 (NASB)

<sup>13</sup> For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are of sound mind, it is for you. <sup>14</sup> For the love of Christ controls us

# 3. Understanding the love of God moves us, uses us, sends us, rules us, motivates us, and drives us.

### 2 Corinthians 5:14-15 (NASB)

- <sup>14</sup> For the love of Christ controls us, having concluded this, that one died for all, therefore all died;
- <sup>15</sup> and He died for all, so that they who live might no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf.

# 4. Understanding the love of God heals us, restores us, washes us, strengthens us, stabilizes us, and saves us.

### 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 (NASB)

<sup>14</sup> For the love of Christ controls us.......<sup>16</sup> Therefore from now on we recognize no one according to the flesh; even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know *Him in this way* no longer.

<sup>17</sup> Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *he is* a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.

#### John 3:16 (NASB)

<sup>16</sup> "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.

## 5. Understanding/believing God's love defines us, positions us, and focuses us.

#### 2 Corinthians 5:14 . . . 18-21

- <sup>14</sup> For the love of Christ controls us
- <sup>18</sup> Now all *these* things are from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the <u>ministry of reconciliation</u>,
- <sup>19</sup> namely, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation.
- <sup>20</sup>Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.
- <sup>21</sup> He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.
