## Joshua 24:14-18 (NIV)

- <sup>14</sup> "Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your forefathers worshiped beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD.
- <sup>15</sup> But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."
- <sup>16</sup> Then the people answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD to serve other gods!
- <sup>17</sup> It was the LORD our God himself who brought us and our fathers up out of Egypt, from that land of slavery, and performed those great signs before our eyes. He protected us on our entire journey and among all the nations through which we traveled.
- <sup>18</sup> And the LORD drove out before us all the nations, including the Amorites, who lived in the land. We too will serve the LORD, because he is our God."

## Judges 2:11-14 (NIV)

- <sup>11</sup> Then the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the LORD and served the Baals.
- <sup>12</sup> <u>They forsook the LORD</u>, the God of their fathers, who had brought them out of Egypt. <u>They followed and worshiped various gods of the peoples around them</u>. They provoked the LORD to anger
- <sup>13</sup> because they forsook him and served Baal and the Ashtoreths.
- <sup>14</sup> In his anger against Israel the LORD handed them over to raiders who plundered them. He sold them to their enemies all around, whom they were <u>no longer able to resist.</u>
