## Character - #8 - Humility, cont.

- 1. Any created being is going to be less than God by the very fact that they are created.
- 2. When God created Adam He could do not better; if God could have, He would have.
- Adam was created with the capacity for character growth; He could become more than he was at the point of creation.
- 4. God created Adam to fellowship with Himself for all eternity
- 5. The distance between God and Adam in character was too great at the point of creation for intimate fellowship, so God created the world.
- 6. God in His wisdom created the world to be a perfect greenhouse for growing character.
- 7. Character is not created; it is developed by our correct response to life.
- 8. God's desire is that we grow to become as much like Jesus in character as is possible in this life.
- The more like Jesus in character that we are, the more we will enjoy Him and the more He will enjoy us forever.
- 10. What we are in character when we get to heaven is what we will be for all eternity.
- 11. To think that God will fix our character weaknesses when we get to heaven is to strip life of its purpose.
- 12. To think that God will fix our character weaknesses when we get to heaven is to reward the lazy, unfaithful, worldly, selfish Christians and to penalize the diligent, faithful, sacrificing Christians.
- 13. When we finish with this series on *Character* we will have looked at 33 different character traits. So far we have studied *endurance*, *courage*, and *patience*.
- 14. In our pursuit of genuine humility we must begin with our relationship with God. Micah 6:8.
